- It is not money that people need but access to the necessities of life.

- In a resource-based economy, human welfare is the prime concern and technology is subordinate. It is not technology we should fear, but the misuse and abuse of it.
- The Venus Project concludes that Earth is abundant with plentiful resources. Our practice of rationing resources through monetary control is irrelevant and counterproductive to our survival.
